


C. SUMMIT COUNTY

Summit County is comprised of 78,968 older adult aged 65 and over, accounting for 14.6% of its total population of 541,781.

Females are counted for 58.5% of total older adults aged 65 and over in Summit County, slightly higher than PSA 10B and Ohio's 57.7%.

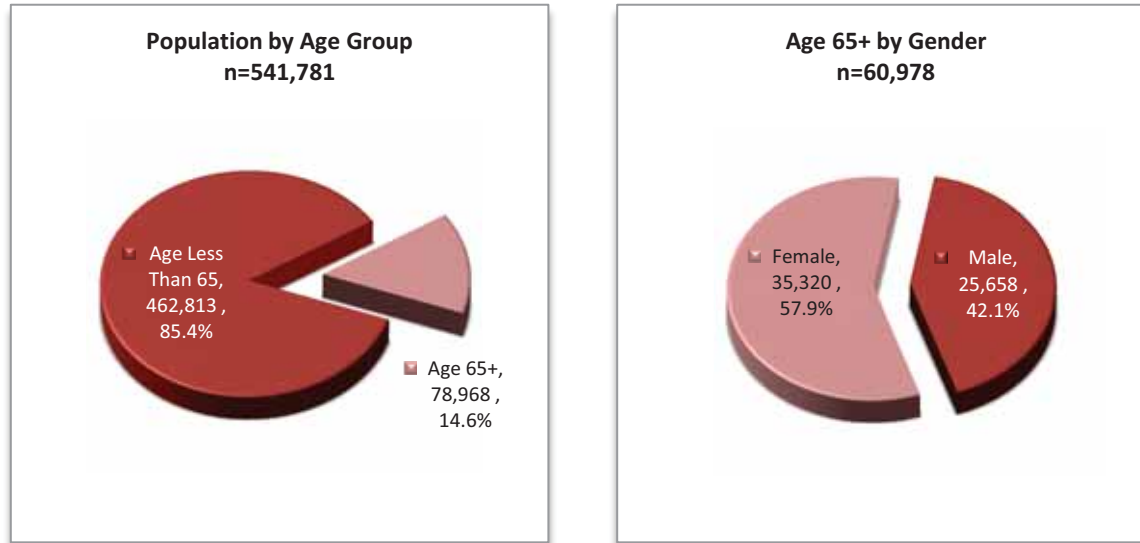

Female population is slightly larger than male at 46,220, counting for 57.9% of total population age 65 and over in Stark County.



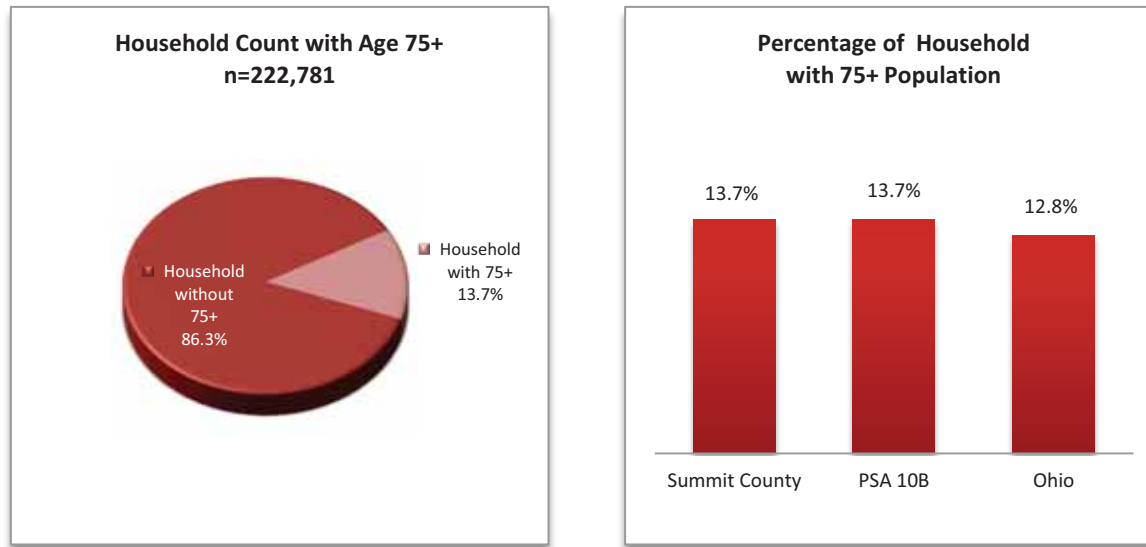

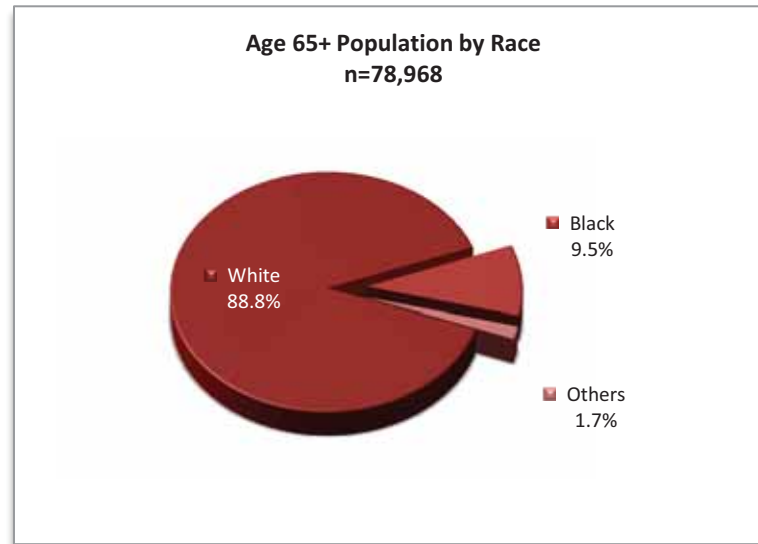

About 88.8% of the 65+ population are White persons in Summit County. Over one in every four [26.6%] older adults age 65 and over living in Akron City are non-White.



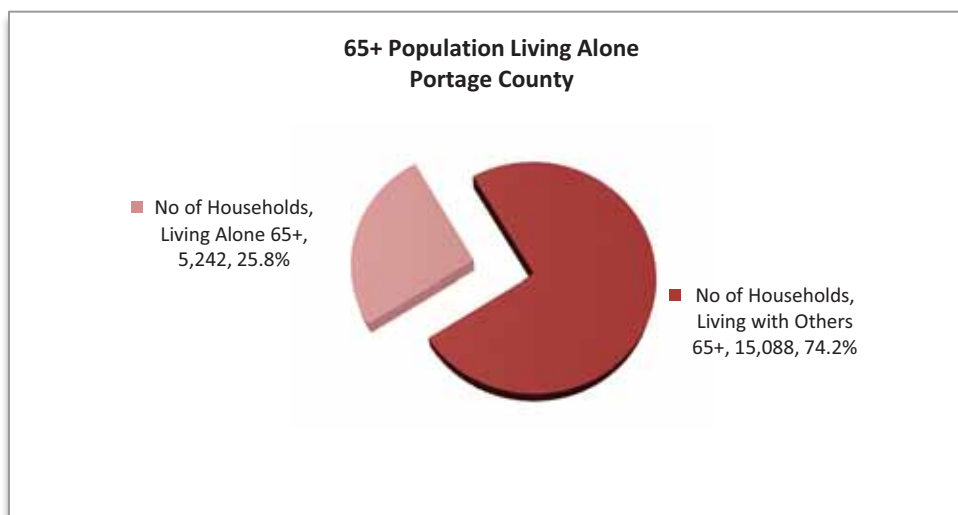

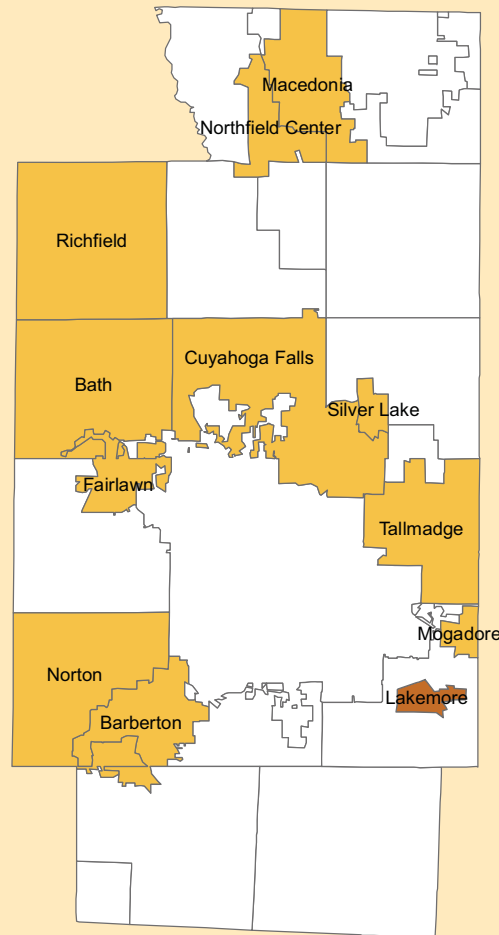

Among the Population 65 Years and Over in Summit County by County Subdivision**

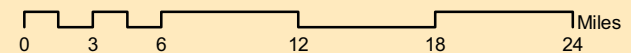
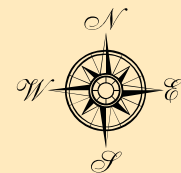

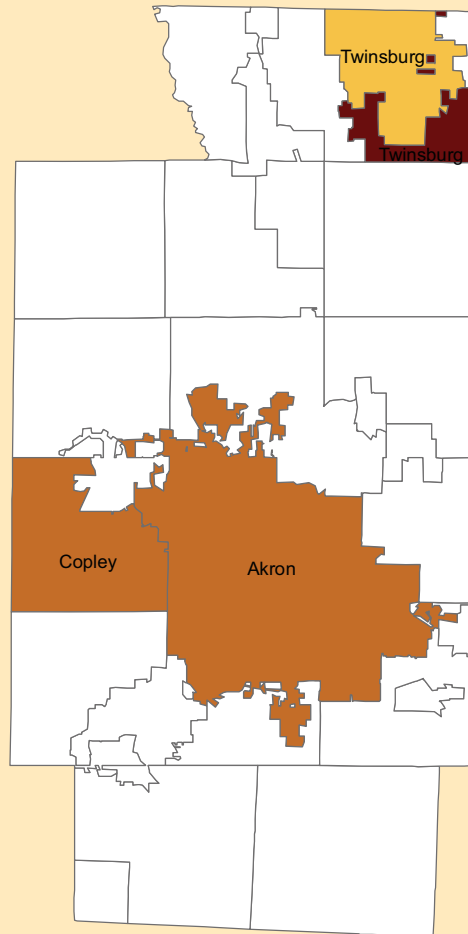

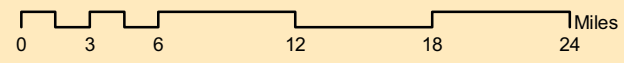

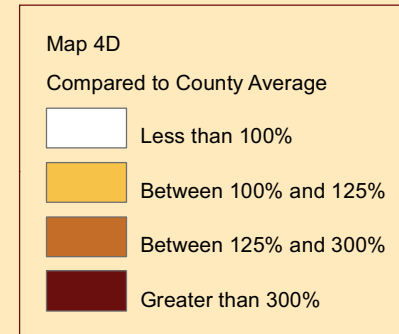

Map 4D. Percent of the Population 65 Years and Over Living Alone in Summit County by County Subdivision

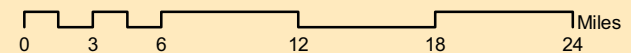
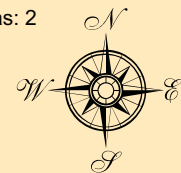

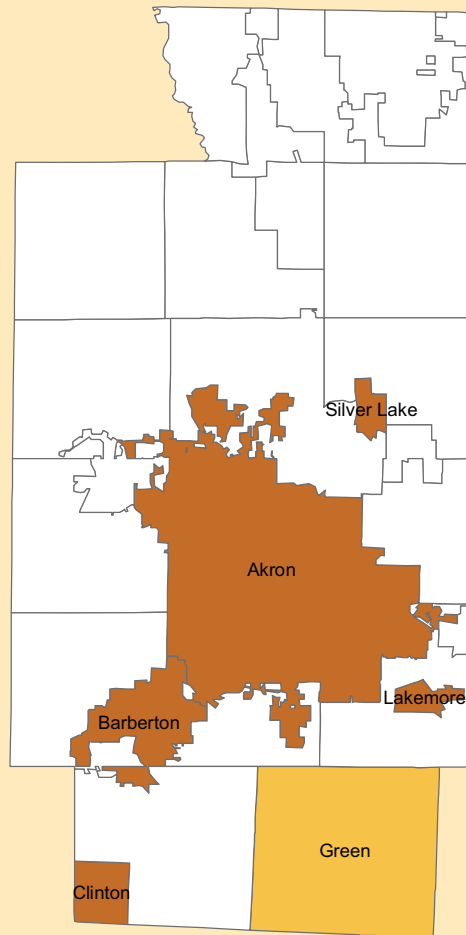

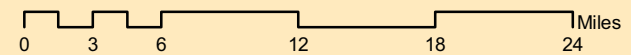
