


## B. STARK COUNTY

Stark County is comprised of 60,978 older adult aged 65 and over, accounting for 16.2% of its total population of 375,586.

Females are counted for 57.9% of total older adults aged 65 and over in Stark County, about the same as PSA 10B and Ohio's 57.7%.

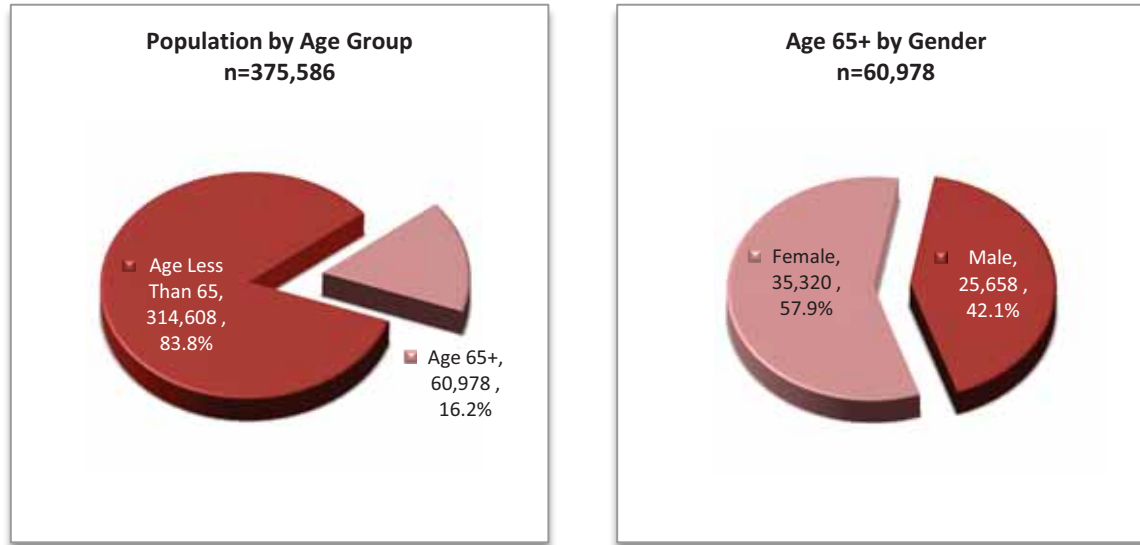

Plain Township has the largest population aged 65 and over [10,206 in total] in Stark County at the subdivision level, followed by Canton City with 1,880.

Bethlehem Township marks the highest proportion of 65+ older adults [22.6%] with respect to their population segment.

Female population is slightly larger than male at 35,320, counting for 57.9% of total population age 65 and over in Stark County.

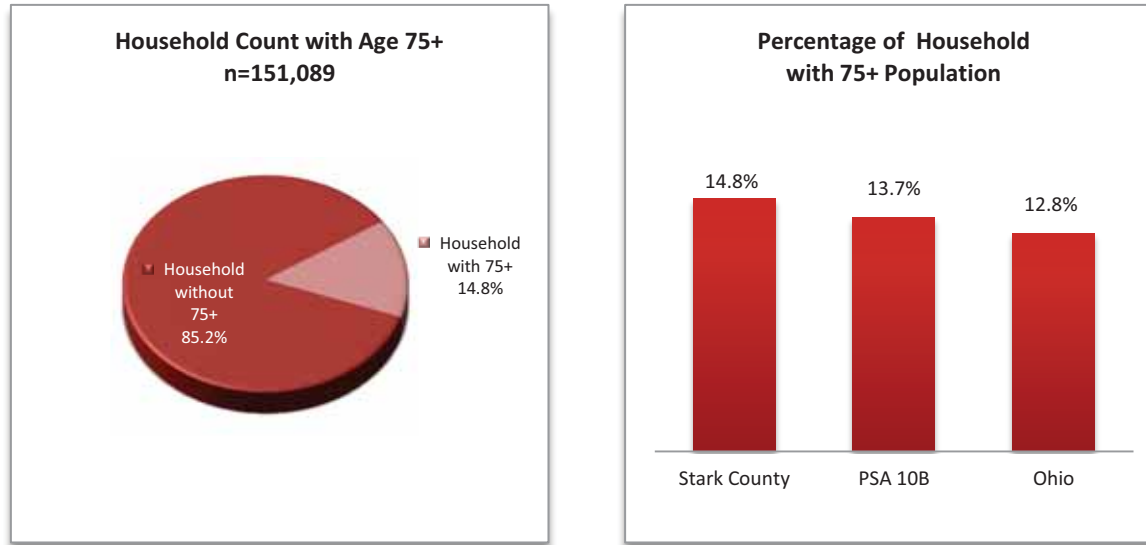

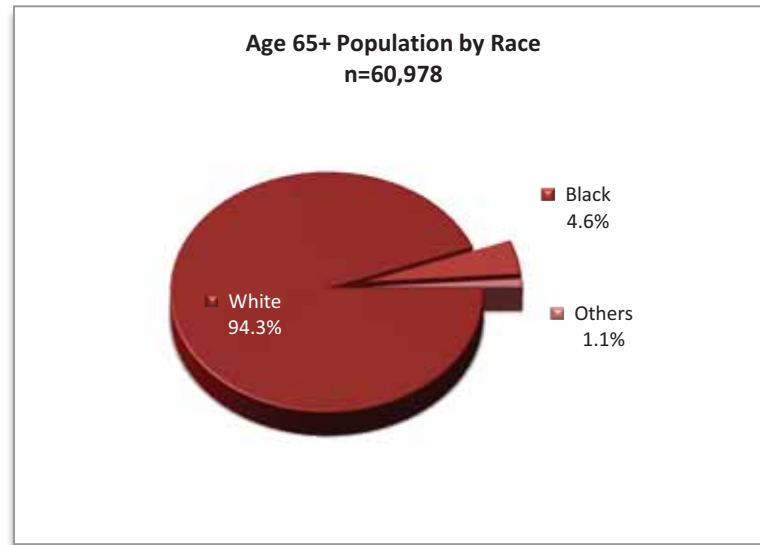

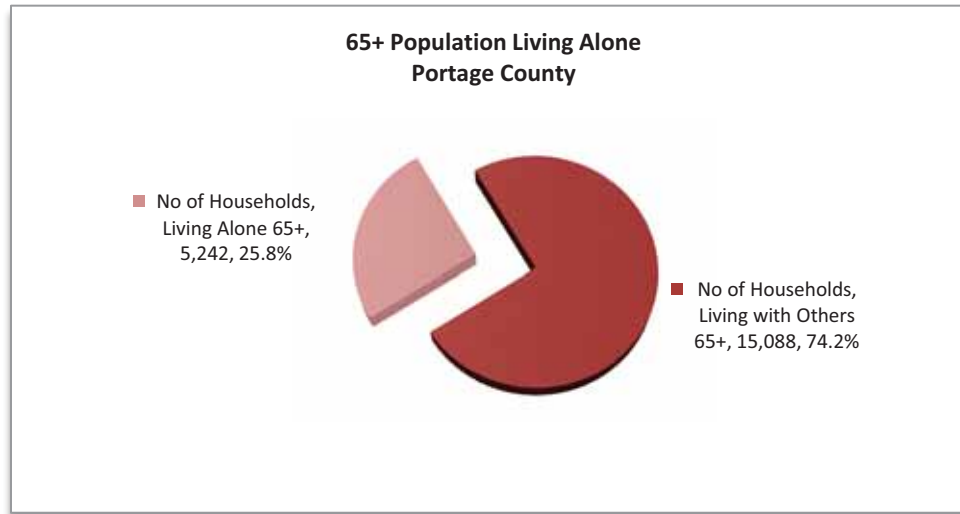

The proportion of county residents 65 years and over living alone has been remained relatively consistent from the 2000 average of 25.1% to the 2010 average of 25.8%. Top five [5] political subdivisions in Portage County whose 65+ populations well exceed 30% of their respective total 65+ populations include: Ravenna city [40.5%], Mantua village [39.6%], Kent city [39.3%], Garrettsville village [34.2%], and Brady Lake village [31.7%].

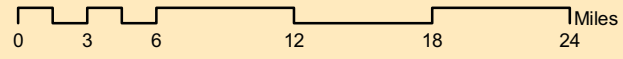

Map 3A. County Subdivision in Stark County

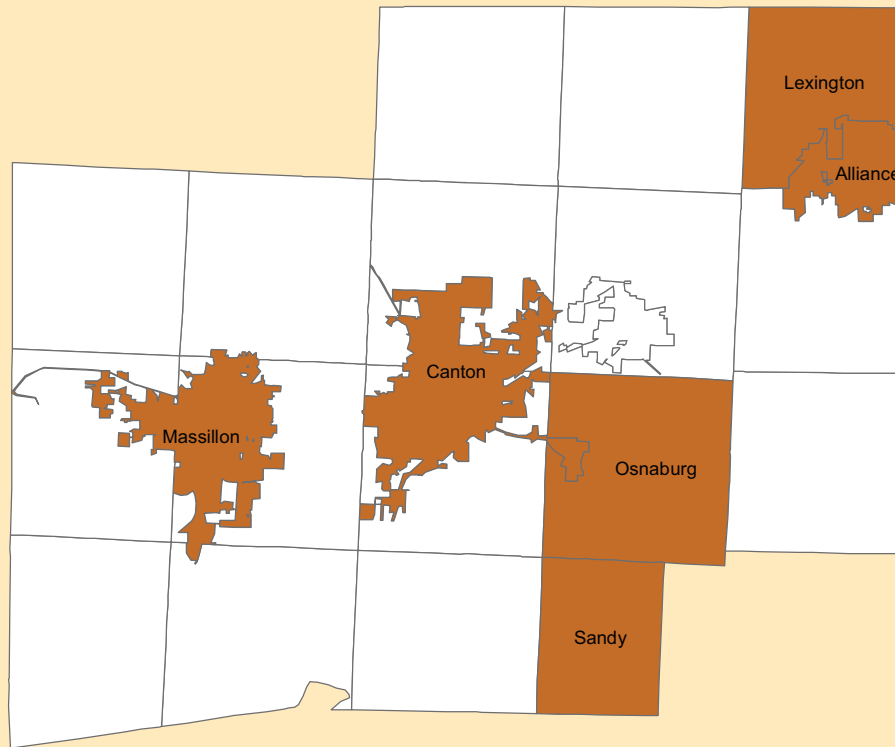


**Map 3B. High Density Areas of the Population 75 Years and Over

**Map 3C. Percent of Non-White Population 65 Years and Over in Stark County by County Subdivision**

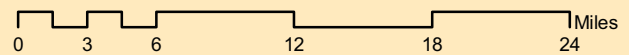
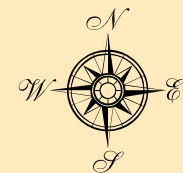

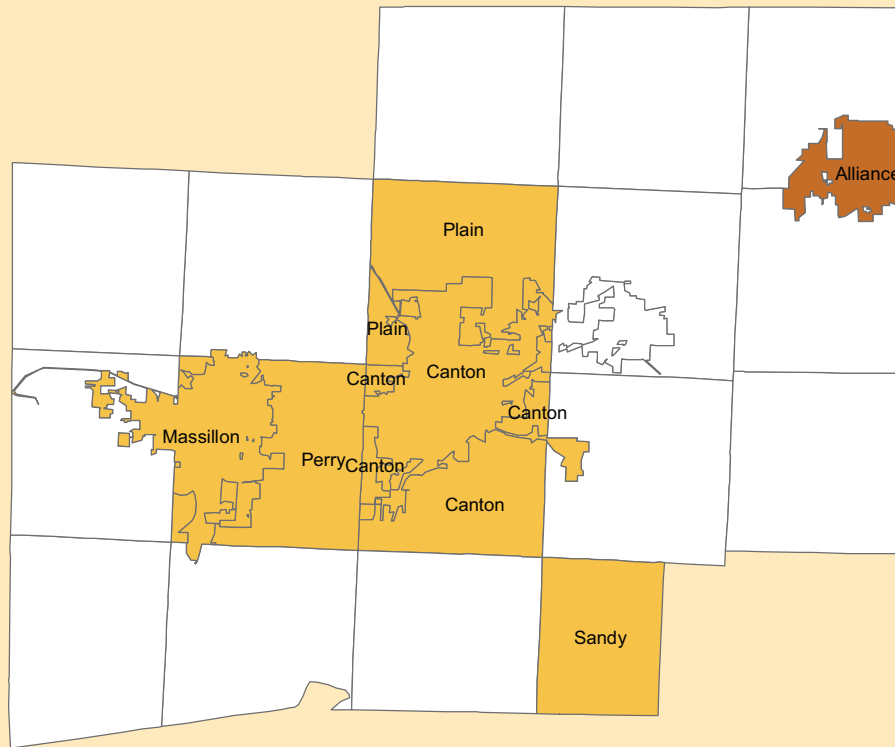

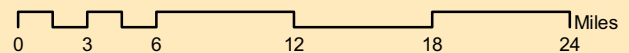
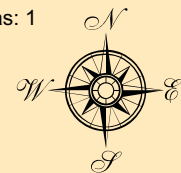

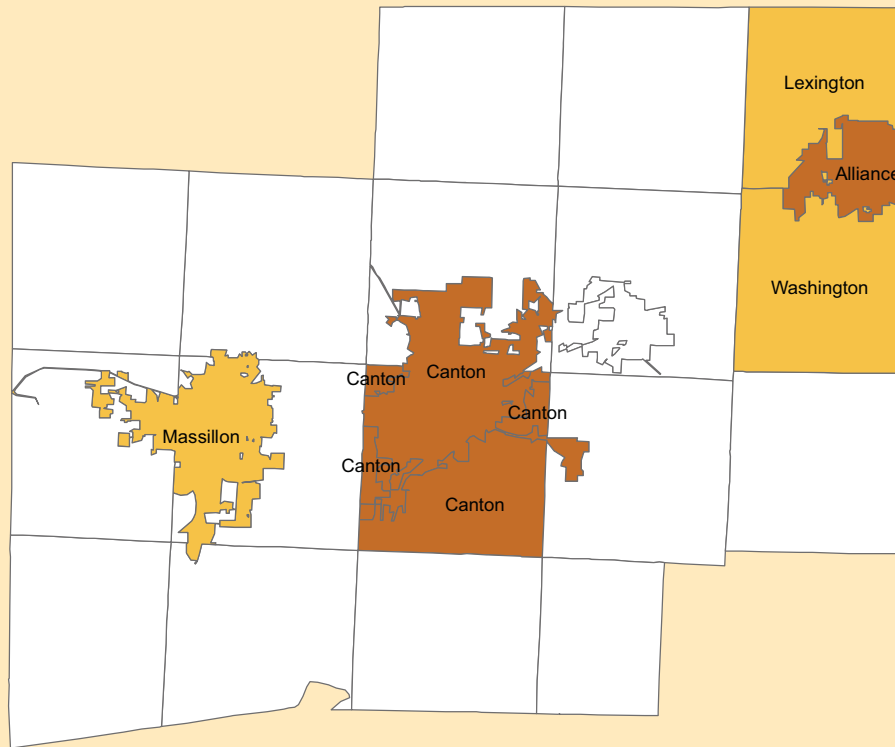

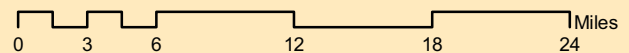
